## VERTICAL MARKERS (CONES, ETC.)

Over the years cones have become increasingly helpful for the Image-Loc process. Cones were first used to mark anchor locations on replacement covers. Now, they are a helpful tool when it comes to any pool. We encourage the use of cones on any and every pool. Below are examples of how to place cones on different types of pools.

#### 1. Basic Pools



The cones are spread out randomly around the entire pool. They are set several inches back from the pool line and do not obscure the view of the pool line or any scale blocks.

### 2. Raised Spas



When taking photos of raised spas for Image-Loc, it is important to place cones on top of the spa as well as on the pool level below it. Make sure the cones do not obscure the inside corners of the spa or where the spillway connects to the spa.

#### 3. Raised Walls and Rock Wall



With raised walls and rock walls it is important for cones to still be placed around the pool as with a simple pool. The cones around the obstruction should not interfere with the view of the obstruction itself. Be sure to avoid placing cones directly where any rock or raised wall starts or ends on the deck.

#### 4. Basins



When a pool has a basin, cones should be placed on both the upper and lower levels of the pool, as well as on the vanishing edge. Note how the cones are not directly placed on corners or at the edge of any area.

### 5. Commercial Pools



Commercial pools require more cones. They should be generally placed evenly around the entire area in a way that does not obscure any part of the pool line or any obstructions.



Replacements require all anchors to be marked with markers in order for the new cover to match up with the old anchor locations. Markers can also be placed in other areas as long as somewhere in the information sent over to Loop-Loc there is a description of which markers show anchor locations and which ones don't. As you can see in the above image, the dealer filled out the Additional Information section of the photo measure form to indicate which cones were for anchors.

### 7. Other Types of Markers





If you do not have the Image-Loc kit, which provides the orange cones, other objects such as 16 oz. plastic cups or other vertical markers can be used. These markers should be of similar length to the cones in the kit and brightly colored. When using cups for markers be sure to fill the cups with water to prevent the cups from moving while taking Image-Loc photos.
